

Travelling to No. 1 Mann Island

Mann Island, Liverpool L3 1BP





No. 1 Mann Island is easily accessible by rail, bus and ferry, so you have a wide range of travel options to choose from when visiting. There is also ample public parking.

This leaflet helps explain how to get to the building by public transport and via the local road network.



Walking to Mann Island

Mann Island is located close to major tourist attractions, public transport facilities, offices and retail areas in the city centre. It's easy to reach Mann Island by foot. Most of the city centre is within a 1600m walk from the site. There are pedestrian crossings at the Mann Island/ The Strand/James Street junction just outside the building.

Trains to Mann Island

The nearest train station is James Street, less than 200m away which served by frequent Wirral Line trains.

If you arrive in the city at Liverpool Lime Street, jump on a Wirral Line train from Lime Street underground station to James Street. If you arrive in the city centre on a Northern Line train, get off at Moorfields station and take the Wirral Line to James Street.

Buses to Mann Island

Many bus routes serve the area around Mann Island.

Liverpool ONE Bus Station is located about 600m away. There is also a main bus and rail interchange on James Street, less than 200m away.

Mersey Ferries to Mann Island

A direct commuter service operates between Seacombe and Pier Head during Monday to Friday morning peak times, between 0720 – 0950. Ferries run every 20 minutes, with the crossing taking just 10 minutes. During afternoon peak times, between 1615 - 1915, the ferry travels between Pier Head, Seacombe and Woodside, and then back to Pier Head. Afternoon ferries run every 30 minutes.

Driving to Mann Island

Mann Island is easy to reach by road. The Strand (A5036), the main road that passes outside Mann Island, links the city centre with the A561 to the north and the A562 to the south. These main roads then connect with the main ring road, Queens Drive (A5058).

Nearby motorways include the M57 to the north, the M62 to the east and the M53 from Wirral via the Kingsway Mersey Tunnel.

Cycling to Mann Island

Route 56 of the National Cycle Network runs through Liverpool city centre and beside riverside developments at Otterspool, towards Sefton Park and beyond. It also links Pier Head with the Wirral via the ferry terminal at Pier Head – bikes can be taken free of charge onto the ferry – and connects the site with Route 62 (The Trans Pennine Trail).
