## Memorandum of Understanding (Tier Zero)

The organisations signing this Memorandum of Understanding (Tier Zero) recognise a collective responsibility to minimise the burden of data collection and to ensure that data collected is done so lawfully, and is used effectively, to support the overall aims of all partner organisations across Cheshire and Merseyside Health and Care.

It is recognised that the Integrated Care Board (ICB) is the statutory organisation (from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2022), and that the Digital and Data Programmes come under the Integrated Care Systems (ICS). In recognition of that, the Tier Zero was updated in June 2022, ready for the July 2022 transfer. It is further updated one year on.

This Memorandum of Understanding is part of a framework designed to support information sharing initiatives within Cheshire and Merseyside.

Nationally, organisations involved in the commissioning and provision of health and social care services are identifying substantial requirements to share and use Personal Confidential Data (PCD) in order to:

- Deliver safe and effective direct care to service users supported by information held by other organisations.
- Plan and organise appropriate care/services for people.
- Deliver planned improvements in care delivery and financial efficiency.
- Protect vulnerable people from harm.

The increasing need for organisations to appropriately share information is emphasised in:

- ✓ The addition of a seventh Caldicott Principle in 2013: "The duty to share information can be as important as the duty to protect patient confidentiality"
- ✓ The introduction of the Health and Social Care (Safety and Quality) Act 2015, which sets out a legal duty requiring health and adult social care bodies to share information with each other for the direct care of individuals.

### Memorandum of Understanding (Tier Zero)

#### **Commitment to the Key Principles:**

- Data will only be shared and processed where there is a legal basis to do so.
- Data should be collected once, shared appropriately and used in a way which is compatible with the legal basis.
- Collection and sharing of data should be fully supported by a Data Protection Impact Assessment (DPIA).
- To ensure the security of data when stored and during transmission.
- All staff with access to shared data will undertake Data Protection training at least once per year, and that the training will also ensure that staff groups are aware of their personal responsibilities in relation to the use of personal data.
- The organisation will have in place appropriate policies and procedures that ensure data is only used, processed and stored in a way which is compliant with the UK GDPR Data Protection Principles.

### Other Partners providing and/or receiving Data.

In addition, the Lancashire and South Cumbria partners (GP Practices, NHS Trusts and Local Authorities) commit to work with Cheshire and Merseyside partners (and vice versa) with the digital programmes, in particular with Share2Care (e-Xchange platform), and so are part of this MOU.

Data is shared with health and social care partners outside of the Cheshire and Merseyside ICS. Currently this is limited to sharing with health and social care in Lancashire and South Cumbria via an e-Xchange platform connection. Over time sharing will be extended to other organisations with legitimate direct care relationships.

Additional Data Processors may be added over time, such as when additional software is needed to support the programme for direct patient care. Access may also be given to other Data Controllers over time, so that data will be available to clinical staff in other areas, who have a legitimate reason to access it for their patient's direct care.
