## Response

The Womens Hospital Services in Liverpool Programme is currently developing a case for change which sets out the issues and risks that are faced by patients when accessing hospital services in Liverpool for gynaecology and maternity conditions. This case for change will be considered by the Hospital Trust Boards that are leading the work of the programme board, and the ICB Womens services Committee over the next 2 months. If the case for change is accepted by NHS C&M, then a period of public engagement about the case for change will commence in the autumn. The case for change will not make any proposals for resolving the current risks and issues; options and proposals for the future will be the next phase of the programme which will take into consideration feedback from the public engagement on the case for change.

The ICB is currently seeking expressions of interest for members of the public to join the Lived Experience Panel as part of our engagement approach for the Women's Hospital Services Programme.
